New Member Course Description

The Junior League of Omaha (JLO) New Member course is comprised of four components:

Way of the City – New Members will learn about JLO's relationship with Omaha arts organizations, social service health and education agencies through informative speakers and on-site visits.

In-League Training – New Members learn about JLO history, structure, strategic plan, by-laws, projects, fundraisers and finances from current and past JLO leaders.

Volunteer Training – These class sessions allow New Members to develop necessary skills for effective volunteer leadership such as parliamentary procedure, committee structure, budgeting and more.

Active Volunteering – A requirement of all JLO members, New Members will put their learned skills to the test with a series of hands-on volunteer opportunities with local agencies and programs.

In addition to these components, new members will also help support existing JLO projects and fundraisers, including H.I.P. (Healthy Inspired Proactive) Kids, the Junior League of Omaha's Jumble Shop, and the American Girl Fashion Show.

Current Community Projects

Dance Without Limits, a part of the Girl Scouts Outreach Program at King and Liberty schools, allows a group of 4th graders to learn fitness techniques and express themselves through rhythm and movement. A resident artist leads and coordinates the program of dance instruction. Junior League of Omaha members provide additional support and leadership exhibited through positive interaction with the Girl Scouts.

H.I.P. (Healthy, Inspired, Proactive) Kids creating a community that encourages, promotes and provides healthy eating and activity choices for children. The project partners with Club Possible, a collaboration of four agencies that provide youth education on nutrition and fitness.

Since its start, the Junior League of Omaha has donated over \$1.9 million dollars and more than 1.4 million volunteer hours to our community.
